Feasts and Memorials

22 JUNE

Saints John Fisher, Bishop and Thomas More Martyrs 1469-1535. John Fisher was born in Beverley, Yorkshire. He studied theology at the University of Cambridge, eventually becoming its chancellor, and was ordained priest and later Bishop of Rochester. He combined diligent pastoral ministry with continuing study and writing, especially in defence of Catholic doctrine. Shortly before his execution, he was created cardinal by Pope Paul III. 1478-1535. Sir Thomas More studied at the University of Oxford, married twice and had a son and three daughters. A noted social philosopher, humanist and apologist, and professionally an incorruptible judge and parliamentarian, he served as Speaker and Lord Chancellor. St John Paul II made him patron saint of statesmen and politicians. Both were drawn into conflict with Henry VIII over his remarriage and ultimately over papal supremacy. Both were imprisoned and beheaded for treason. They are remembered for their intellectual acumen, for their devotion to the

Church, and for their uncompromising integrity and courage.

Saint Paulinus of Nola, Bishop 355-431. Born Pontius Paulinus at Bordeaux in France, he rose high in public service, married and had a son, but wishing to embrace a more austere life he received baptism, gave up all his worldly goods and in 393 he began to live the

monastic life at Nola in Campagna. Elected Bishop of Nola, he did much to promote the veneration of his predecessor St Felix, helping the pilgrims and doing what he could to relieve the misery of that time. He composed a number of poems which are outstanding for their literary quality and is credited with introducing bells to

Christian worship.

23 JUNE

St Etheldreda (Audrey), Virgin C636-379. Born a princess in Suffolk, Etheldreda became a Northumbrian queen and, having left her second husband while still a virgin, became the Abbess of Ely, the double monastery she founded in 673 on the site of what is now Ely Cathedral. She was the most venerated of the women saints of Anglo-Saxon England, renowned for her dedication to a life of chastity, and for the austerity of the regime she imposed on herself in her later years. The relic of her hand is enshrined at the Catholic

parish of St Etheldreda in Ely.

24 JUNE

The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist

BC/AD. This solemnity celebrates the birth of John the Baptist, a designation attested in the

generation after his death by the Jewish historian Josephus. Unlike most saints, whose feast days commemorate their death ('heavenly birthday'), John's nativity is honoured because

of his unique prophetic role in preparing the way for Jesus and inaugurating his ministry with baptism. The day therefore highlights themes of repentance and conversion, as John preached in anticipation of Christ's coming, and the fact that

baptism makes prophets of us all.

27 JUNE

Saint Cyril of Alexandria, Bishop and Doctor of the Church C375-444. Born in Byzantine Egypt, Cyril entered a monastery, became a priest and

then succeeded his uncle as Patriarch of Alexandria in 412. He fought strenuously

against the teachings of Nestorius and took the lead at the Council of Ephesus, which designated the Blessed Virgin Mary as Theotokos (Mother of God). He wrote many

works to explain and defend the orthodox Catholic faith.

28 JUNE

Saint Irenaeus, Bishop and Martyr c130-c202. Brought up in the Greek city of Smyrna (now called Ismir in Turkey), Irenaeus. -.as a disciple of its bishop St Polycarp. By the year 177, he was a priest at Lyons in France and was soon chosen as its second bishop, although nothing certain is known about his death. In his writings such as 'Against heresies', he sought to defend the Catholic faith against the errors of the Gnostics, advocating the orthodoxy of three pillars: following scripture (especially the four

Gospels) and the tradition of the apostles handed on through apostolic succession.






