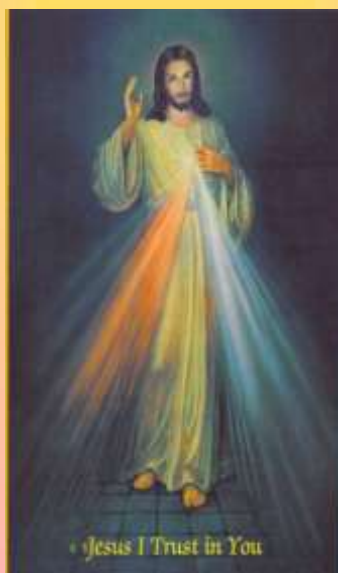

Feasts and Memorials

9 JUNE

Saint Ephrem, Deacon and Doctor of the Church

C306-373. Born of a Christian family in Nisibis on the Syrian-Turkish border, he was ordained a deacon and worked both in his own country - he is particularly venerated among Syriac Christians - and at Edessa where he laid the foundations of the School of Theology. After attending the Council of Nicaea, he lived a life of asceticism, though at the same time he did not neglect the ministry of preaching. He wrote a number of works to refute the errors in doctrine current at the time, as well as biblical commentaries and hymns. He died while ministering to plague victims.

Saint Columba, Abbot

521-597. St Columba or Colm Cille, was born in Gartan, Co Donegal, and died at Iona in the Inner

Hebrides. He was of royal lineage and studied under Finnian of Moville and Finnian of Clonard. Before leaving Ireland as an 'exile for Christ', he had founded monasteries at Derry, Durrow, and possibly Kells. His principal foundation was Iona, which became for centuries the dominant religious institution in Scotland, from where he converted many to Celtic Christianity, and his followers took the Gospel to northern England. He was renowned as a poet and scribe as well as a spiritual guide. In

Gaelic literature, he appears as Ireland's most popular saint, noted for his great personal love of all creatures, human and animal.

11 JUNE

Saint Barnabas, Apostle

C1. Born on the island of Cyprus, he was one of the first converts in Jerusalem and preached at Antioch. As recounted in the Acts of the Apostles and mentioned in several Pauline epistles, he became a companion of St Paul, accompanying him on his first missionary journey, and he took part in the Council of Jerusalem. He returned to his native land to preach the Gospel - following the conversion of the Roman pro-consul, it was the first country to be ruled by a Christian leader - and there he died, becoming its patron saint.

13 JUNE

Saint Anthony of Padua, Priest and Doctor of the Church

1195-1231. Born Fernando Martins de Bulhoes at Lisbon, Portugal, he became a canon regular of St

Augustine, but after being ordained priest he joined the Friars Minor, adopting the name Anthony, so that he might preach the Gospel among the people of Africa. But having fallen sick in Morocco, it was in France and Italy that he exercised most of his ministry of preaching with great profit and brought many heretics back to the faith, as well being devoted to the poor and the sick. He became the first theologian of his Order and wrote a number of sermons which are renowned for their doctrine and their gentleness.

He died at Padua and was canonised by Pope Gregory IX within a year. Surrounded by legends, he is widely regarded as the patron saint of lost things.

16 JUNE

Saint Richard of Chichester, Bishop

1197-1253. As a boy in Droitwich, Worcestershire, Richard de Wych worked on his father's farm, though he eventually went to the universities of Oxford, Paris and Bologna. He was not ordained priest until he was 45 years old. He was appointed Bishop of Chichester two years later, but because of the king's opposition he was unable to take over the see until 1247. Meanwhile, he lived in a priest's house, visiting the parishes of his diocese on foot, and looking after an orchard. He is remembered for his generosity to the poor, the mercy he showed to sinners, and the reform of the liturgical life of his diocese.

18 JUNE

Saint John Rigby (of Wigan), Martyr

c1570-1600. Born into a large family at Harrock Hall, Wrightington, John was an unmarried layman working as a steward for Sir Edmund Huddleston when his own recently revived faith came into question while pleading for someone else at the Old Bailey. Imprisoned, he twice refused the opportunity to recant, and was hanged. Cut down too soon, he landed on his feet, but was thrown down and disembowelled, to the dismay of those watching. He was canonised as one of the 'Forty Martyrs' in 1970, along with the Franciscan St John Jones, who had reconciled him to the faith and was executed two years earlier.
